From 2003 to 2016 he was the Japanese representative at the ICC Court of Arbitration in Paris and he is a member of the panel of arbitrators of the International Centre for Settlement of Investment Disputes – ICSID, Washington.

Prof. Schroeder is a partner at Freshfield Bruckhaus Deringer in Hamburg, honorary professor at the Leibniz University Hannover and a qualified mediator. He is admitted to the bar in Germany and England and Wales. He practices commercial arbitration and investment arbitration in addition to a state court litigation practice. He frequently sits as arbitrator, while most of his arbitration work is in the role of counsel. Patrick Schroeder has a special interest in conflict management and advises parties on various ADR mechanisms.
